Madeleine reported they have an institutional plan which will be "digested" through the relevant bodies beginning in September. One of the goals is to streamline assessment process. In the fall semester, they will be piloting a general education students' learning outcome assessment program. She will be asking David Laderman if he could mention on opening day in the fall whether they could recruit about 15 faculty members from various disciplines and these faculty will receive stipends. These faculty members will decide on one of the General Education learning outcomes to assess. More details to come in the fall semester.

a. Fall Flex day activities

Teresa Martin updated GC regarding the fall flex day activities – Thursday (Aug 13) & Friday (Aug 14) are the flex days. District opening day is on Thursday. The various campuses will have their opening day on Friday. The Center for Academic Excellence Committee will meet this week to review the draft of the flex day agenda. They wanted to make sure that they incorporated time for departmental meetings on the Friday flex day. Deans have requested for time to have division meetings and this may occur on the afternoon of the Thursday flex day. The District Academic Senate and District Curriculum Committee wanted to make sure we have time for disciplinary meetings and

this is planned for Thursday afternoon as well. On Friday, we are hoping to have a guest speaker after Michael Claire's welcome, and include workshops. Michele Titus, who will conduct one of these workshops, shared that they will plan to tour two museums in Fort Mason: the Mexican and Italian-American museums. Theresa also shared that one of the themes that will be coming out of the Center for Academic Excellence, Basic Skills and DIAG committees is respect and diversity. There will also be a panel of veteran students sharing their experience as veterans. The agenda will not be finalized for another two weeks. Dan Kaplan inquired regarding the speakers. Theresa shared the possible list: Eddie Moore, Jeff Duncan Andrade, etc. There might also be some "SLO" workshops.
