She said that the Film Club will be holding a Workshop on October 15 from 12 to 1 p.m. Vice Chair Nguyen added that Thrive will continue its weekly Bible Study sessions on Wednesdays and Thursdays at 12:30 p.m., and that Book Club is planning a Book Jeopardy event and exploring collaboration with another club.

Mr. Schaefer reminded the clubs pending activation to complete leadership meetings and submit the required paperwork. Mr. Hamadeh emphasized the importance of submitting funding requests early and announced that a

budget update will be shared at an upcoming meeting. Ms. Bathai encouraged clubs to reach out for assistance with event logistics or forms.

Mr. Hamadeh announced that upcoming agenda items will include additional funding proposals.





DESCRIPTION

Summit is a student-run short film festival at the College of San Mateo designed to celebrate this school's creativity, community, and storytelling. The festival gives students of all skill levels the chance to create, submit, and screen their short films before a live audience in the CSM Theatre. A judging panel composed of faculty and students will select finalists to be shown, and awards will be given for Best Picture, Best Screenplay, Best Acting, Best Editing, Best Cinematography, and Audience Vote.

Summit promotes artistic expression, collaboration, and campus engagement. It gives students real-world experience in filmmaking, event planning, and production while providing a space to share diverse voices and stories. The festival also helps build community by uniting students from all disciplines through a shared love of film and creativity.

The total funding request is \$1,700, which covers awards for six categories—\$300 each for the five main awards, \$200 for Audience Vote award. We plan to request separate funding closer to the event for food and beverages for attendees.

The festival will take place in the CSM Theatre on February 24th, 2026, from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM, featuring the screening of selected films, audience voting, and an awards ceremony. The festival is free to submit to, and free to attend. The only eligibility required to submit is that the individual must be a CSM student.

The event is organized by the Summit Committee, a team of five dedicated CSM students who will oversee submissions, judging, event planning, and operations. Additional student volunteers will assist with setup, ushering, and cleanup.
