APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion to approve the agenda by Thrive Club; seconded by Brazilian Club. Hearing no objections, the motion was carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING(S)

Motion to approve the meeting minutes of November 18, 2025, by Book Club; seconded by Thrive Campus Ministry. Hearing no objections, the minutes were approved as presented.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

REPORTS

Chair Leticia Dominguez congratulated clubs for their consistent attendance and gave a special shoutout to the Film and Production Club for their strong efforts. She reminded members to always arrive prepared for Senate meetings and expressed pride in everyone's productivity this semester. She announced that emails regarding the Spring Club Fair and the first ICC meeting of next semester will be sent out soon. All clubs with funding proposals approved at today's ICC meeting must attend the Student Senate meeting on Monday, December 1. Ms. Dominguez also confirmed that ICC will continue meeting every Tuesday from 1:15 to 2:15 p.m. in the spring.

Vice Chair Samantha Nguyen expressed how proud she was of all the clubs for their recent events and hard work. She wished members good luck on finals and hoped everyone would enjoy a restful Thanksgiving and winter break.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Fauzi Hamadeh reminded students to plan ahead, noting that Student Life would be closed the following afternoon. Clubs were encouraged to visit the Center for Student Life on Monday, December 1, for assistance before the break. Advisors also encouraged students to consider running for Student Senate positions. Clubs were reminded to submit pending reimbursements promptly, since any reimbursements submitted after the college closes for winter break will not be processed until January. Paperwork for spring clubs may be submitted starting December 1. Mr. Hamadeh thanked everyone for their involvement in ICC and looked forward to the next semester.

FUNDING FOR FOOD FOR CULINARY CLUB COLLAB – JAPANESE CULTURE CLUB

A collaborative funding request of \$610 was presented for a spring onigiri-making workshop. The request includes \$500 for premade food and \$45 for sanitary equipment, with additional supplies such as gloves available through Student Life. The workshop will take place in the Maker Space in the Library and is expected to serve approximately 20 participants. Since the event will occur next semester, the clubs requested approval now to use funds in spring. Motion to approve by Puente Club; seconded by Transfer Club. The funding proposal was passed with all clubs present voting in favor except for the Entrepreneurship Club, which voted no.

FUNDING FOR THRIFT STREET MARKET – SAGE CLUB

SAGE Club presented a request totaling \$716 for a thrift event starting in February, which would include serving boba and partnering with Plato's Closet to redistribute clothing to CSM students. Mr. Hamadeh noted that not enough logistical information was provided, specifically regarding purchases, agreements with Plato's Closet, and event setup. Because the event lacked sufficient detail, Culinary Club and Financial Futures withdrew their motions, and the funding request was tabled until next semester.

FUNDING FOR HOLIDAY HOT CHOCOLATE MAKING WORKSHOP – CULINARY CLUB

The Culinary Club requested \$150 to host a stress-relief event during finals in collaboration with the Library. Toppings will be purchased from Safeway, which may require a reimbursement form. The club was reminded that reimbursement requests must still be approved in advance through ICC. Funding amounts may be adjusted if supplies such as cups are needed. Motion to approve by Thrive Club; seconded by Puente Club. The funding proposal was passed with all clubs present voting in favor except for CSM Democrats, Entrepreneurship Club, and Electronics Club, which opposed the funding.

FUNDING FOR END OF THE SEMESTER CELEBRATION – COMPUTER SCIENCE CLUB

The Computer Science Club requested funding for an end-of-semester celebration featuring fast food, drinks, and other refreshments. Approximately 20 participants are expected. Mr. Hamadeh expressed concern that the quantity of food requested seemed high for the projected attendance and recommended adjusting the funding request before the December 1 Senate meeting. Motion to approve by Book Club; seconded by Thrive Campus Ministry. The funding proposal was passed with all clubs present voting in favor except for Entrepreneurship Club, which voted no, while SAGE and Sista2Sista abstained.

FUNDING FOR LAST FALL MEETING – MEDICAL SCHOLARS CLUB

Due to the absence of a representative from the Medical Scholars Club, this item was tabled until a future meeting.

FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

The council noted that next week will be the final Student Senate meeting of the semester. Remaining funding proposals will be reviewed, and further discussion of the Spring Club Fair will continue. ICC will also revisit meeting procedures and brainstorm improvements next semester.

FINAL ANNOUNCEMENTS AND HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

Members were reminded to remain respectful and thoughtful during all funding discussions. Representatives should be prepared for questions and stay open to change. Leadership expressed pride in everyone's hard work and encouraged clubs to maintain a positive and collaborative environment.
