## MLA STYLE GUIDELINES 8<sup>th</sup> EDITION (2016)

Following are formatting guidelines for citing various types of sources, followed by examples. For situations not covered here, ask a librarian or consult the MLA Style Guide in the Ready Reference area. Please see the Works Cited handout to see how to properly format (font, indenting, spacing, margins, etc.) on your Works Cited page.

The 8<sup>th</sup> edition of the MLA Handbook provides a "universal set of guidelines" for citing sources across all format types. These guidelines state that, if given, these core elements should be included in the citation; if any of the elements are not present, simply omit them from your citation:

1. Author 6. Number (vol. and/or issue)

2. Title of Source 7. Publisher

3. Title of Container 8. Publication date

4. Other Contributors 9. Location (DOI# or URL) – optional\*

5. Version/edition

\*About URLs: URLs are recommended in MLA 8 when they redirect a reader directly back to the original resource. The link should be consistent (not likely to change) and a reasonable length. If including a URL, omit http:// or https://

Book: physical, printed version consulted	FORMAT: Author. Book Title. Publisher, publication date.  EXAMPLE: Bloom, Harold. How to Read and Why. Scribner, 2000.
Online book: from a <u>library database</u> or other online	FORMAT: Author. Book Title. Publisher, publication date, Database Name, URL (non-library books only).
database	EXAMPLES: Schoots, Hans. Living Dangerously: A Biography of Joris Ivens. Amsterdam UP, 2000,  Ebook Central.  Burnett, Frances Hodges. Little Lord Fauntleroy. Scribner & Sons, 1866, Google Book  Search, books.google.com/books/about/Little_Lord_Fauntleroy.html.
Magazine, Newspaper, or Journal article: from a <u>library</u> <u>database</u> (most common)	FORMAT: Author. "Article Title." Publication Title, vol.#, no.#, pp.#-#, Day Mon. Year published, (page numbers). Database Name, URL (optional) or doi#.  EXAMPLES: Updike, John. "Nan, American Man." The New Yorker, 3 Dec. 2007, pp. 84-85. Literature Resource Center.  Hulse, Carl. "Congress Passes Bill to Keep Government Running." New York Times, 1 Oct. 2009, pp.A1. General OneFile.  Moellendorf, Darrel. "Treaty Norms and Climate Change Mitigation." Ethics & International Affairs, vol.23, no.3, Fall 2009, pp. 247-66. Academic OneFile.

Magazine, Newspaper, or Journal article: from a website (not from a library database)	FORMAT: Author name. "Article Title." Publication Title, vol.#, no.# (if available), Day Mon. Year published, URL.  EXAMPLES: Jensen, Cheryl. "Fastening Seat Belts: The 3 Seconds that Save Lives." Consumer Reports, Aug. 2016, www.consumerreports.org/ car-safety/fastening-seat-belts-3- seconds-that-save-lives/.  Okie, Susan. "Fighting H.I.V., a Community at a Time." New York Times, 26 Oct. 2009,

Magazine, Newspaper, or Journal article: physical version consulted (less common)	FORMAT: Author. "Article Title." Publication Title, Day Mon. Year published, vol.#, no.#, pp.#-# (page numbers).  EXAMPLES: Brown, Carolyn M. "More Bang for the Buck: Moving to Georgia Saved the Salmon Family Thousands in Education Costs and Property Taxes." Black Enterprise, Jan. 2007, pp.62-63.  Sterngold, James. "Prisons' Budget to Trump Colleges." San Francisco Chronicle, 21 May 2007, p.A1.  Brandtzaeg, Per. "Why We Develop Food Allergies." American Scientist, JanFeb. 2015, vol.95, no.1, pp.28-35.
Webpage <u>from a</u> <u>larger website</u> (most common)	FORMAT: Author name (if present). "Webpage Title." Website Name, Website publisher (omit if same as website name), Day Mon. Year published, URL.  EXAMPLE: Lohrey, Jackie. "How to Write a Successful Resume." eHow, Leaf Group, www.ehow.com/how_4710883_write-successful-resume.html.
Entire website (less common)	FORMAT: Website Name. Publisher Name (omit if same as website name), Day Mon. Year published (if present), URL.  EXAMPLE: eHow. Leaf Group, www.ehow.com.
